Von der Leyen II - Reading Guide

Overview

Today, the European Parliament in plenary session approved the new College of Commissioners with 370 votes in favour, 282 against and 36 abstentions. The new political team of the Commission will officially take office on 1st December 2024, marking the start of President Ursula von der Leyen's second mandate.

Compared to the last legislative term, this Commission takes a more right-wing political orientation, as the composition of the College is as follows:

President von der Leyen has decided to eliminate the role of a simple Vice President, instead establishing six Executive Vice Presidents. Each of them will be responsible for one or more macro-areas, coordinate the work of four Commissioners, and manage the corresponding portfolios. This decision creates a structure in which **the Commissioners' mandates are highly interconnected**.

This document provides a detailed overview of the composition of the new College and its hierarchical structure, with a particular focus on the priority dossiers the Commission intends to present within the first 100 days of its term and throughout 2025. It also outlines the individual teams to which the President has assigned specific areas of work, under the leadership of the Executive Vice Presidents. For each Commissioner, the programmatic guidelines are presented, highlighting the most significant points of interest.

The Competitiveness Compass builds on the roadmap outlined in the **Draghi Report** and will be the first major initiative of the new Commission. The reflection initiated in the Compass will guide the Commission's policy orientation and future legislative initiatives.

The legislative workplan for 2025

Priority initiatives and proposals to be submitted within the year

By the end of 2025, the Commission aims to continue its legislative work in the most important policy areas, according to the priorities highlighted by President Von der Leyen during her confirmatory hearing.

In particular, the Commission foresees to put forward the following:



A new strategy for Al in the energy sector

A long-term vision in which the Commission will outline the goals to be achieved and the future legislative proposals with which it intends to pursue these goals in order to fully exploit the potential of digital technologies also in the energy sector.



A new biotechnology act

Part of the Life Sciences Strategy, the new European Biotechnology Act will introduce measures to facilitate the transition of biotechnology from the laboratory to the market, thus facilitating its application in various end sectors including health and medical research.



REACH Revision and PFAS Restrictions

The revision of the REACH chemicals regulation aims to modernize the regulatory framework and simplify the individual authorizations required for hazardous substances and to ensure the controlled use of PFASs.



A new regulation on single digital reservation and ticketing

This legislative initiative aims to ensure that European citizens can purchase a single ticket through a single platform and benefit from the protection of passenger rights for the entire journey.

A new European port strategy

The strategy will identify all major challenges facing the port system and outline future legislative proposals to address these issues. The strategy will focus in particular on safety and competitiveness, building on the work of the Alliance of European Ports.



A plan to connect EU capitals and big cities with high-speed trains

The Commission's plan aims to improve cross-border rail connectivity, with a focus on the most peripheral areas. The new networks should be financed through the CEF and cohesion funds.



A new strategy for the internal market


A new horizontal internal market strategy is envisaged for a modernized and more integrated single market promoting the cross-border provision of services and the cross-border movement of goods, including essential goods. The plan aims to ensure full enforcement of existing rules and to accelerate the removal of barriers.



A new series of important projects of common European interest (IPCEI)

The Commission aims to identify a new set of IPCEIs because they make a significant contribution to economic growth, employment, the green and digital transition and the competitiveness of EU industry and the economy.
